Institutional eligibility criteria:

The funding from the Ministry of Environment and Food of Denmark for this call is under the auspices of the Board of the "Green Development and Demonstration Programme" (GUDP) and is administered by the Danish Ministry of Environment and Food.

GUDP is a funding programme with focus on motivating and promoting ambitious and green business oriented innovation activities in the Danish agriculture, fisheries and food sector. Thus, GUDP projects must induce green sustainability and economical sustainability simultaneously through the entire value chain. Green sustainability means having a focus on the environment, climate, nature, quality, sustainable exploitation of resources, food safety, human health, and animal welfare. Economical sustainability means having a focus on generating profit, socio-economic effects and addition of value to raw materials to support growth and competitiveness.

Projects shall meet the needs of the food industry and have to follow the rules and regulations of GUDP. In addition, it is a requirement that Danish participants submit a separate business plan <u>BEFORE THE PRE-PROPOSAL DEADLINE</u> in order to be eligible for funding. More about the business plan can be read below.

Additional information:

For Danish applicants, the rules of GUDP prevail, but the international application- and budget templates should be used; only in case of funding, a budget scheme, participant datasheets and Gantt chart for the Danish part of the work has to be submitted.

Applications for funding can be submitted by:

- Large, medium and small size enterprises (incl. stakeholders and similar associations, independent institutions, private research organizations, owners, tenants and users of farms)
- Research and other public knowledge institutes
- Technical Service Institutes (GTS) are classified as companies

Funding from GUDP cannot be granted directly to foreign institutions or businesses registered outside of Denmark; they can however be part of the Danish participation in a project on a consultancy basis.

Institutional eligibility criteria:

Estonian Research Council (hereafter The Council) funds basic and applied research. Applied research is only funded as far as it does not refer to product development with commercial value and for marketing purposes. A grant or research support is the allocation of funds by the Council for a specified purpose to carry out research work and the grant shall be awarded within an open competition.

Participants in the grant project

1. Principal Investigator is the applicant of the grant, to whom the grant has been allocated within an open competition and who is responsible for the use of the grant for specified purpose and for the productive realisation of the grant project. The Council shall enter into a grant agreement with the Principal Investigator.

The Principal Investigator:

- Is either an Estonian citizen or a permanent resident of Estonia.
- Has an updated profile in the Estonian Research Information System (ETIS).
- Has as a rule entered into an employment relationship with the legal person (hereinafter Institution), which is the basis of the realisation of the grant project and through which the grant shall be allocated to the Principal Investigator.
- Holds the doctoral degree of Estonia or an equivalent academic degree, awarded by the deadline of submission of the grant application, at the latest.
- Must have published within the last five years prior to the proposal's submission deadline at least three publications, which comply with the requirements of clauses 1.1 of the classification of publications of the ETIS, or at least five publications, which comply with the requirements of clauses 1.1, 1.2, 2.1 and 3.1 of the classification of publications of the ETIS; international patents are equalised with publications of clause 1.1.; the monographs (ETIS category 2.1) are equalised to each author with three publications mentioned in clause 1.1 if the number of its authors is three or less. If the applicant has been on the parental leave or in the compulsory military service within these last five years, the deadline of the publication requirement shall be extended by the time stayed on the parental leave or compulsory military service.
- 2. The main participant of the project is a person who participates in the substantial performance of the project. The main participant of the project shall either possess at least the master's degree or the respective qualification and must have published at least one publication within the last three years

prior to the proposal's submission deadline, which comply with the requirements of clauses 1.1, 1.2, 2.1 or 3.1 of the classification of publications of the ETIS; or be a doctoral candidate.

What is the maximum funding amount?

The budget limit for Estonian teams is **100 000 €**. In case of two Estonian partners (research teams) their combined budget may not exceed the same limit.

What types of cost are eligible?

- 1. The budget of a proposal should consist of research expenses and overhead costs of the Institution.
- 2. The **research expenses** consist of direct costs (personnel costs incl. scholarships, travel costs and other direct costs) and subcontracting costs. The expenses on research are clearly required to carry out the project and respectively identifiable.
- 3. **Remuneration** may be only paid out of the grant to the Principal Investigator, main participants in the project and auxiliary staff according to the time they participate in the grant project and their total salary cost for Institution. Double funding of activities already have contributions is not acceptable.
- 4. **Scholarships** to doctoral candidates not paid any salary by Institution. Please contact the National Contact Point (ETAg) about scholarship rules.
- 5. **Travel costs** cover expenses for transport, accommodation and daily allowances (except in case of internal travel).

6. Other direct costs are:

- 6.1. Consumables related to the project
- 6.2. Costs for publishing and dissemination of project results (fair distribution of costs between partners should be followed)
- 6.3. Costs for organising the meetings/seminars/conferences (only in Estonia)
- 6.4. Fees for participating in scientific forums and conferences
- 6.5. All other costs which are clearly required for the implementation of the project and respectively identifiable.
- 7. **Subcontracting costs** should generally cover only additional or complementary tasks (e.g. costs for translation, analyses, etc.) to the third parties. Core project research tasks should not be subcontracted. Subcontracting costs may not exceed 10% of the total costs.
- 8. **Overhead costs** of the institution must not exceed a maximum of 20% of eligible direct costs and should cover general expenses of the institution.
- 9. Costs for equipment and services intended for public use (copying machine or printer publicly used, phone bills, copying service, etc. shall be covered from the overhead fee.
- 10. Participants' personal expenses or expenses not directly related to the project are not eligible.

Other requirements

If a human research or animal tests are intended in the research project, the positive resolution of the Ethics Review Committee or Animal Testing Project Permits Committee with respect to the performance of the project addressed to the Council shall be submitted before the funding decision is made.

The main national criteria emphasizes that the research shall benefit the agri-food livelihood. The work carried out must be pre-competitive research and/or prototype demonstration. Product development supporting individual companies will not be supported. Financial involvement must be clearly stated in the application. The application must contain a plan for communication of results.

Funding does not cover expenditures for activities before the project has been granted. Normally 70 % of the project's gross eligible costs can be covered by the MMM funding. Applicants must provide the necessary apparatus for the project themselves. If a special apparatus is needed an explanation and application for funding for apparatus must be included. If the applicant has not earlier given the explanation for indirect employee costs and overheads the applicant has to give an account to the ministry.

Institutional eligibility criteria:

Proposed projects may not exceed 36 months.

- One project can require a minimum of 15.000 € per partner and up to 200.000 € per project (300.000
 € in case of a French partner coordinates the full project).
- Applicants must include at least one French public research organization category (university, EPST Scientific or Technical Public Institution, EPIC – Industrial or Commercial Public Institution...).
- In the case there is a foreign company within a proposal, the participation of a French company is mandatory. In this case, the IP rights have to be clearly defined within the full proposal.
- The French part of the project proposal must not be judged similar to a project (or part of a project) that is already financed by the ANR or submitted to another ANR call for proposals.
- The French part of the project proposal must not be considered to infringe an intellectual property right characterizing a counterfeit within the meaning of intellectual property.

Important recommendations:

- If the project coordinator is a French organization, the project coordinator should devote at least 30% of his/her research time to the project;
- The total (in person months) of the non-permanent personnel (postdocs, fixed-term contracts, temporary workers) receiving ANR funding should not exceed 30% of the total (in person months) of the staff (permanent and non-permanent personnel) of the French partners assigned to the project;
- The financing duration for each post-doctoral fellowship should not be less than 12 months.

Institutional thematic priorities:

- Enhancement of new and/or predictive breeding technologies and the development of new genotypes leading to new phenotypes towards the release of improved crop varieties that are capable to adapt to future changes in environmental and climatic conditions. Projects could also target improvement of variety selection processes to support agroecological practices.
- 2. Development and exploitation of integrated pest and crop management methods and practices. This includes, for example, basic and translational research leading to practical on-farm applications and/or the development of novel detection systems for integrated pest and crop management.
- 3. Improvement of resource-use efficiency of cropping systems by agroecological approaches to increase the efficiency of nutrient, water and energy utilisation. This could include the use of improved crops.



4. Investigations on agricultural crops as part of an ecosystem. Studies must have a clear focus on interactions between plants and other organisms leading to practices that support more sustainable agriculture.

Eligible institutions:

- Universities, research institutes and RTD centres entered into the Registry of Scientific institutions of Latvia;
- Enterprises are eligible only if entered into the Latvian Commercial Registry, assumed they are eligible to do specific research and have proven resources for specific activities.

Limitations of EU legislation apply together with financial reporting requirements and support rate limits. Project leader and the principal investigators should be researchers according to Latvian legislation ("zinātnieks") possessing doctoral degree and experience in relevant research field, and the work carried out should be research.

Eligible costs:

- Personnel costs, including social tax,
- Consumables, materials,
- Subcontracts and external services up to 25 % of direct costs, needs detailed justification. Includes all publishing and patenting costs, knowledge engineering and dissemination services,
- Equipment (only depreciation costs),
- Travels costs (according to travel plan),
- Indirect costs (up to 20 %, the indirect nature of cost position must be proven).

Core activities cannot be subcontracted.

Educational activities are not supported.

Maximum grant is 30 000 EUR. Funding of cost positions not related to the project is not allowed; time sheets and invoices should correspond to the actual national legislation. Funding release is subject to final audit which can invoke a sworn auditor.

The grant will be awarded after the following steps are accomplished:

- the submitted project proposal with eligible Latvian beneficiary organization is in accordance with the criteria in the National Annex;
- the respective Project proposal is selected for the award by the transnational evaluation procedure,
- the Project Consortium Agreement is signed.

All proposals must be aligned with National regulations, inter alia:

- The Act of 30 April 2010 on the National Centre for Research and Development, published in Journal of Laws item 1447, 2017 (with amendments);
- The Regulation of the Minister of Science and Higher Education of 25 February 2015 on criteria and rules on granting state aid and "de minimis" aid by the National Centre for Research and Development, published in Journal of Laws item 299, 2015.

Eligible costs:

The eligible costs shall be the following:

- 1. *personnel costs* (researchers, technicians and other supporting staff to the extent employed on the research project);
- 2. costs of instruments and equipment, technical knowledge and patents to the extent and for the period used for the research project; if such instruments and equipment are not used for their full life for the research project, only the depreciation costs corresponding to the life of the research project, as calculated on the basis of good accounting practice, shall be considered eligible;
- 3. **costs for buildings and land**, to the extent and for the duration used for the research project; with regard to buildings, only the depreciation costs corresponding to the life of the research project, as calculated on the basis of good accounting practice shall be considered eligible; for land, costs of commercial transfer or actually incurred capital costs shall be eligible;
- 4. *cost of contractual research*, costs of consultancy and equivalent services used exclusively for the research activity; this cost type cannot account for more that 70% of all eligible costs of a project; the subcontracting can





be obtained from consortium partner only in justified case, this need will be verified by a national experts panel:

- 5. *other operating costs* including costs of materials, supplies and similar products incurred directly as a result of the research activity;
- 6. *additional overheads* incurred indirectly as a result of the research project; that costs cannot account for more than **25%** of all eligible project costs; That costs (6) are counted as a multiplication by percentage given above (called x%) and the rest of direct costs, excluding subcontracting (4); It means 6=(1+2+3+5)*x%.

National funding rates:

Funding quota of Polish participants can be up to 100% for research organizations. In the case of enterprises, funding quota will be decided on a case-by-case basis depending on the size of the company, type of research/development, risk associated with the research activities and commercial perspective of exploitation. Organization must be registered in Poland.

Legal entities established in Romania are eligible to get funding, i.e. public and private accredited universities, national R&D institutes, other research organizations, SMEs, large industrial enterprises with R&D activity within their domains.

We can fund only Romanian research teams. For universities, public institutions, R&D national institutions funding is 100%, and for SMEs and Large companies, financing is under the permit <u>NASR Decision no 9281/8.13.2015</u> approving the scheme of State aid for Program 3: European and international cooperation.

The Principal Investigator of Romanian team must hold a Ph.D. degree. This condition does not apply if the Romanian host institution is an enterprise according with the specific European and national laws.

One research team leader will participate only one time in a proposal within the trans-national call as responsible or coordinator.

No simultaneous funding is possible for more than one application under the same call.

The Principal Investigator of Romanian team is full time employed within the host institution with permanent position, with fixed term contract covering at least the duration of the project or has an agreement with the host institution for his/her employment at least for the duration of the contract;

It is forbidden to submit a proposal which seeks to fund activities already funded by other public sources;

The host institution does not have a seizure on its accounts; it has not been declared bankrupt or wound up; it has not made false declarations concerning its economic and legal statute; it has not broken other contract previously signed with a public contracting authority;

The host institution agrees to ensure the necessary administrative support, to provide access to all necessary resources/infrastructures, to support the project implementation in good conditions and to employ the members of the Romanian team, in respect of all legal provisions in force, if the project is selected for funding.



The following categories of expenses are eligible:

- A. Staff costs (researchers, technicians and support staff, including all corresponding state and social contributions; these contributions are subject to national regulations in force);
- B. Consumables (materials, supplies or similar);
- C. Equipments (in full compliance with state aid regulations), no more than 30% of the total funding from the public budget;
- D. Subcontracting (expenditure on services performed by third parties cannot exceed 25 % of the funding from the public budget). The subcontracted parts should not be core/substantial parts of the project work;
- E. Travel expenses (in Romania or abroad, only for project teams members);
- F. Overheads (calculated as a percentage of direct costs: staff costs, travel expenses and logistics costs excluding capital costs). Indirect costs will not exceed 20% of direct costs, excluding subcontracting. Expenses are eligible if incurred after signature of the contract.



- 1. Enhancement of new and predictive breeding technologies and the development of new genotypes leading to new phenotypes and the release of improved crop varieties that are capable to adapt to future changes in environmental and climatic conditions. Projects could also target improvement of variety selection processes to support agroecological practices.
- 2. Development and exploitation of integrated pest and crop management methods and practices. This includes, for example, basic and translational research leading to practical on-farm applications and/or the development of novel detection systems for integrated pest and crop management.
- 3. Improvement of resource-use efficiency of cropping systems by agroecological approaches to increase the efficiency of nutrient, water and energy utilisation. This could include the use of improved crops.
- 4. Investigations on agricultural crops as part of an ecosystem. Studies must have a clear focus on interactions between plants and other organisms leading to practices that support more sustainable agriculture.
